Shows how many students attend schools located in this Queensland electorate.



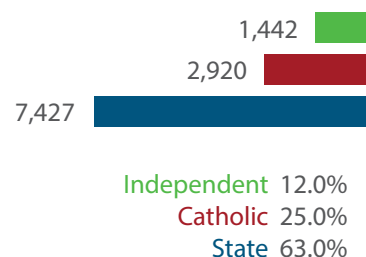

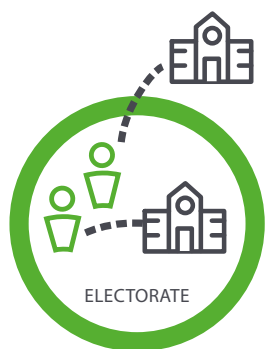

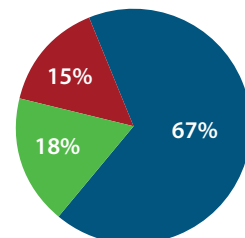
