

This module outlines schools' obligations under the *Disability Standards for Education 2005* to provide reasonable adjustments for students with disability so they can access and participate in education on the same basis as other students to achieve learning outcomes.

Differentiation for Students with a Disability

This module supports school and curriculum leaders, and those responsible for the professional development of teachers, who engage with students with disability in Prep to Year 12. It examines the educational compliance and participation requirements for students with disability along with strategies for differentiating curriculum, assessment and pedagogical approaches, and methods for recording adjustments.

The module clarifies the difference between effective and ineffective teacher aide practice and provides guidance to school leaders when planning to improve the effectiveness of teacher aide use in maximising student learning outcomes.

Throughout the modules, references and activities guide the participant to consider the staged descriptions of English language proficiency for all school-age learners.


